

A child that goes to sleep in a calmer, happier mood is much more likely to wake in the same manner, making their experience of the operating theatre environment a positive one. The item may be a fidget toy such as a stress ball, Rubik's cube, note pad, pencil case, stationery, etc or any kind of small toy. The items must of course be new and in original packaging." ***
