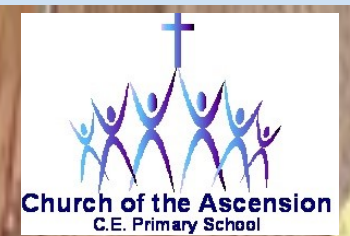


English at Church of the Ascension Primary School
